## Residents give thumbs up to new Primary School plans

Dozens of Kingswood Parks residents and prospective parents recently attended a special consultation meeting about the new Kingswood Parks Primary School, which is planned to open in September 2014.

The event was held at the Kingswood Health Centre on March 6th where representatives from Hull City Council and Hull Esteem Consortium unveiled initial plans for the new building and facilities. Visitors were also given the chance to see an artist's impression of the primary school, which will form part of the new village centre development on land near the Kingswood Health Centre.

Prospective parents got to see their first glimpses of the contemporary, purpose-built new school which will cater for 315 primary aged pupils, with a 26 place nursery and 20 place pre-nursery.

With a modern design and extensive facilities, Kingswood Parks Primary looks set to provide a fantastic learning environment for the benefit of the growing number of families with young children moving to the Kingswood Parks area.

In addition to hi-tech academic facilities including dedicated ICT and Food Technology suites, the new school will also boast an extensive outdoor play area.

Plans also included provision of a community space which will be available for the use of local groups, organisations and residents for a wide range of different activities and events.

The overall reception from those that attended the event was very positive, with residents praising the design, proposed location and high standard of facilities. Most felt that the new

school would provide a massive boost for Kingswood Parks, providing a much needed educational facility whilst helping to improve the community feel of the area.

Mum-of-two and Kingswood Parks resident Yasmine Houston was looking forward to having the new school on her doorstep, and was impressed with the plans:

*"I'm really looking forward to the new primary school, it's exactly what the area needs. The design of the building and quality of the facilities look fantastic, and I think that having dedicated areas for use by the community is a positive move."*

Her son Josh, 7, was also excited about the prospect of having a school located in the area:

*"I would like to go to the new school, so I can make friends who live nearby."*



For resident Rachel Hemmerman, the timing of the project couldn't be better:

*"My son Kyan will be turning 3 just as the new school opens, and it will be really nice for him to be able to go to a new primary school so close to home. The facilities are great, and I think that the modern design of the school fits in well with the rest of the area."*

*"Personally, I'm also looking forward to making friends with all the other parents – I think it will help to bring all the residents together."*

At the consultation, residents were given the chance to give their thoughts on the new plans, and whilst some concerns were raised, a further meeting has now been arranged where details and potential issues raised at the consultation will be ironed out.

With the plans set to be finalised in the next couple of months, it is hoped the building work will start in Autumn. As always, we'll be keeping a keen eye on the development, and will continue to provide updates on the school in future editions of the Kingswood Parks Voice.

# Future's bright for Kingswood Parks community

## New facilities chosen by residents set to transform Village Centre

Kingswood Parks has continued to develop apace since it was voted "the best place to live in Hull" in a 2006 poll.

Now, plans to develop a village centre are well underway and will ensure residents enjoy local facilities on their doorstep.

To guarantee that the village centre effectively represents the community, Kingswood Parks Development Company carried out a survey amongst residents asking them about the kind of services they would like to see developed. It proved very popular, and over 400 households responded to the door-to-door survey.

Top of the residents' wish list was a convenience store, followed by a hairdresser, pharmacy and coffee shop. Other popular suggestions included a fish and chip shop, pub, restaurant and bank, with some residents also calling for playgrounds and additional green space.

Kingswood Parks Development Company is working hard to ensure that the area will provide a real variety of services for residents. Ultimately, the aim is to create a development with a real village feel, providing all the services in a welcoming, central space.

Already earmarked for the centre are a village green and public square, as well as both pedestrian and cycle routes and greenways to provide easy access to amenities. Other potential ideas include sheltered housing for the elderly, and a children's play area.

Overall, the future's bright for Kingswood Parks, and we'll be keeping residents up-to-date with the latest news on the development of the village centre as soon as we have it. What we do know is that residents can expect to benefit from an increase in the number of shops, facilities and homes in the near future.

## Construction work on Village Centre is coming to fruition

Residents will notice that roadworks are underway near to Kingswood Health Centre, signalling the start of an exciting development programme on the planned Village Centre.

This work forms part of our Enabling Programme for the Village Centre, meaning that we are moving a step closer to our plans becoming a reality. Over the next six months or so, residents will start to see visible changes in the Village Centre development.

With Kingswood Parks Primary School due to open in September 2014, it is essential that we ensure road access and the correct infrastructure is in place – with this in mind, our contractors are busy working on drainage connections, bus laybys and parking provision.

The road alterations that are currently underway will alter the access in and out of the health centre – all roads will be very clearly signposted to minimise disruption to residents, but full information is available within Kingswood Health Centre.

Once this work is complete, our contractors will then move on to developing the Village Green and Village Square in front of the planned retail units towards the end of the year. Residents will also begin to see the construction of the retail units themselves towards the end of the year, although we are still in the early stages of planning the services that will be available in the units and we are some way off starting discussions with potential tenants.



## Village Centre bus service and yellow line update

In the near future, Hull City Council and bus company Stagecoach expect to begin resident consultation in relation to the provision of bus services to Kingswood Parks Village Centre once it is constructed.

The aim would be for the buses to stop on School Lane to ensure a service is in operation ahead of Kingswood Parks Primary School opening next year.

Hull City Council is also working with Kingswood Parks Development Company on the associated traffic measures, including yellow lines where needed for safety and to enable bus services to run. Consultation work on this is expected to be carried out in the summer.

## Free festival to feature live music and fun for the whole family

This summer, residents across Kingswood Parks should get ready for three days of fantastic live music and family-friendly activities at 'Kings Woodstock' – a free festival to be held in the grounds of The Kingswood pub and restaurant from August 24th - 26th 2013.

Featuring the best bands, acoustic acts and musical talents from across the city of Hull, alongside family activities and attractions provided by established volunteer organisation Voice in Play, it promises to be an unmissable event for residents of all ages.

The new festival is the brainchild of local musician Richard Clark, who has been promoting live music events under the Rooftop Promotions banner at venues across Hull for over 10 years.

Richard wanted to bring the fun and excitement of the Summer Festivals to a local family audience in Kingswood.

He said: "I know that once people settle down and have families, it can be difficult to find the time or money to enjoy the mainstream summer festivals. The idea is to provide a free, local event that's accessible to all – helping parents to introduce live music to children in a fun, safe environment, whilst having a great time themselves.

"Many of the smaller local festivals are no longer running, and I think there's a real desire for more community events like this in and around Kingswood. If Kings Woodstock proves successful, we'll make it an annual festival."

Although the festival will be free to attend, there will also be a series of fundraising efforts throughout the festival for a Children's Hospital.

Kings Woodstock is currently seeking the support of local businesses from around Kingswood to help in any way they can – as Richard looks to make the festival an event to remember for years to come.

## Sunday Live Lounge

In addition to Kings Woodstock, The Kingswood also hosts a monthly music night – Sunday Live Lounge.

Launched in February 2013, the Sunday Live Lounge is a monthly live music event that features an acoustic act, headline band and support. It's a fun evening, where local people can relax in a welcoming environment with a few drinks, whilst enjoying great music from the best regional talent.

Starting out as a couple of one off gigs from local bands The Avenues and Throwing Words over Christmas and New Year, the events proved very popular with regular customers, and the Sunday Live Lounge is going from strength to strength.

Acts include both covers and original bands, with the evening starting at 8.30pm.

## What a Difference a Building Makes

No-one would claim that a new building alone can transform a school – but it is already becoming clear to everyone at The Kingswood Academy just how much difference a bright, attractive and modern environment can make.

The new Academy was opened in January 2013 and has been designed to offer personalised learning pathways to meet the needs of all students.

Developed by Hull Esteem Consortium under the Building Schools for the Future programme, the £25m state-of-the-art facility includes massively improved science, sport and music facilities, alongside an expansive theatre that seats 300.

Staff and students have responded positively to their new home and the building is already contributing to improved outcomes.



Overall attainment and progress headlines show improvement on last year's figures and the Academy is closing the gap with national performance indicators; there has been a 1% improvement in attendance since the move and a significant improvement in punctuality compared to last year.

During the most recent Ofsted visit, HMI found that the new building was supporting strategies to improve students' behaviour and noted that students were taking more responsibility for their own behaviour and that of other students.

Paul West, Head of Global Studies, told us how the design of the new building had impacted on him: "The building is promoting a healthy working environment. I'm enjoying fresh air, I love the feeling of space and having the opportunity to see colleagues at work is inspiring. I really enjoy my break duty as it's a great opportunity to interact with students and colleagues; the flexible day and improved eating arrangements are also having a really positive impact."

Martin Stanley, Head of Music, said: "Before becoming a teacher I was a professional sound engineer and worked in studios up and down the country and the facilities I have at my disposal here are better than some professional studios. It's a privilege to have it and I can't quite believe what's available."



Students have also been highly praiseworthy.

Daniel Tindall-Murphy said: "The new school is absolutely amazing; I reckon it's at least 15 million times better than the old one. I can see there will be better opportunities for me to learn different things."

Emily Inglis said: "I can't really believe that this is my school. It's so fantastic; I really like it and think it will be better for everyone. It's a massive improvement on what we had before; it's all new and shiny. The classrooms and all the corridors and stairways are so much bigger. I really like the playground and the sports hall. I think we'll all be able to learn more and get better results."

Xander Goodliffe said: "All the technology is unbelievable; there are computers everywhere and the science labs are amazing. I really can't believe this is my school. It's exciting to be coming to school and all my friends say the same thing; it really is fantastic."



## The Stage is Set!

The Young Hearts Theatre, based at The Kingswood Academy, is gaining considerable local interest and a programme of performances has now taken shape.



The Academy is working with The Hull Playgoers Society, the Fleur Elizabeth Academy of Dance, Northern Theatre Company, Hull Drama Society and The Hull Musical Society. In many cases, these groups are supporting curriculum delivery and enrichment activities for Academy students.

The official opening event for The Young Hearts Theatre will take place in the Autumn 2013. The opening performance, "Overture", offered theatre-goers "a taste of things to come", featuring a range of short pieces to showcase the upcoming season. The first major performance will be The Hull Playgoers' Society's production of John Godber's "Crown Prince", which runs from May 22nd to 25th.


