A flagship new home store in Hull is set to create more than 200 jobs.

National chain Next wants to build a new clothing, home and garden outlet on land off Runnymede Way, next to Kingswood Retail Park.

The store would employ 220 people and will replace the existing Next fashion store at the retail park.

It could be built within two years if plans are approved by Hull City Council.

The store would also have a 280-space car park. Councillor Danny Brown said he was delighted the store would be coming to Kingswood.

He said: "It is going to be one of the biggest home and garden centres in the area. It will bring people from all over to the area and, from an employment perspective, it's fantastic news."
